CAWS POLICY 3 – CAWS MEDAL FOR LEADERSHIP



COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIAN WEED SOCIETIES (INC) POLICY ON THE CAWS MEDAL FOR LEADERSHIP

(Revision approved 11 December 2013)

- Council wishes to recognise outstanding contributions to weed management in Australasia through the award of a Medal.
- 2. The Medal shall be known as the CAWS Medal for Leadership.
- 3. The Medal shall be a prestigious award and, on average, no more than two Medals shall be awarded at each Australasian Weeds Conference.
- 4. The Award shall be announced every two years by the President of CAWS at the Australasian Weeds Conference.
- 5. The Award shall be an inscribed Medal and a framed Citation signed by the CAWS President.
- 6. The Medal shall be administered by the Awards Committee of CAWS.
 - 6.1. The Awards Committee of CAWS consists of the CAWS President, Immediate Past President and one other person appointed by CAWS.
- 7. The CAWS Secretary shall call for nominations six months prior to every Australasian Weeds Conference, with nominations closing two months prior to the first day of the Australasian Weeds Conference.
- 8. Nominations will be prepared in confidence and treated confidentially by the Awards Committee.
- 9. The Awards Committee will consider the nominations and, after deliberation, inform CAWS of the successful nominees.
- 10. CAWS will consider the recommendations and may endorse the decisions of the Awards Committee.
- 11. For the purposes of the Medal, "an outstanding contribution to weed management in Australia or New Zealand" shall be:
 - 11.1. A contribution to the science, technology and practice of weed management through:
 - Research
 - Teaching
 - Administration
 - Extension
 - · Implementation of programs
 - 11.2. Outstanding in that the contribution is recognised by peers to be exemplary in substance, objectives, methods and results.
 - 11.3. An impact on the work of others.
 - 11.4. Sustained over a long time, perhaps ten years or more.
 - 11.5. Substantial in that the contribution is broadly-based across several categories listed in Section 11.1.

- 11.6. National in its impact. (It should be noted here that locally outstanding contributions may be recognised by Member Societies of CAWS.)
- 12. These criteria for the Medal should be itemised in the Nomination Form to assist the focus of the Nominating Member Societies and the Awards Committee.
